



## **Township of Scugog Municipal Heritage Register**

The Heritage Register is meant to be a celebration of the Township's Heritage and an example of all kinds of properties within the boundaries of the municipality that are important to our community for architectural and historical reasons.

Recent changes to the *Ontario Heritage Act* and the Provincial Policy Statement have put greater status on select cultural heritage resources, including property identified as having cultural heritage value or interest, but not designated under Parts IV or V of the *Ontario Heritage Act*.

The Ontario Heritage Act was amended by Bill 60 in 2005. Previously, the Clerk of a municipality was required to keep a register of properties formally designated under the Act. Amendments through Bill 60 now allow municipalities to add properties to the register that have not been designated under the Act but that a municipal Council, through recommendations of Heritage Scugog, believes to be of cultural heritage value or interest.

The inclusion of non-designated properties on the Registry provides interim protection for sites undergoing change by requiring landowners to provide the Township with at least 60 days notice of their intention to demolish or remove a building or structure on the property. This notice period allows the Township to make a well informed decision about whether long term protection of the property should be sought through the formal designation process.

Any person or organization in the Township of Scugog may nominate a property to Heritage Scugog, the Township of Scugog's Heritage Committee, to undergo an assessment of its cultural heritage value or interest. Site visits are often a part of this process. Once the cultural heritage attributes have been assessed and recorded, Heritage Scugog may make recommendation to Council that the property be included on the Municipal Register.

At its meeting held Oct 1, 2007 Committee received Report PR&C-2007-30 to establish a Heritage Register. The Heritage Register was adopted through Report CORP-2008-22-CNC at the March 31, 2008 Council Meeting.

Old Town Hall (Town Hall 1873)	By-Law 36-75 September 22, 1975	302 Queen St. Port Perry	Constructed in 1873, 1 <sup>st</sup> project of Joseph Bigelow, the 1 <sup>st</sup> Reeve of Port Perry. Many architectural features of Italianate style, reproduction of the original bell tower.
Palmer Memorial Park	By-Law 82-86 November 3, 1986	175 Water St., Port Perry	Palmer Memorial Park, dedicated by the Council of the Village of Port Perry in 1938, containing a statute to honor the memorial of Daniel David Palmer, the discoverer and founder of Chiropractic. The site is to be preserved for the use and enjoyment of the citizens of Scugog.
Head Church & Cemetery	By-Law 64-90 August 27, 1990	16230 & 16250 Island Rd.	Head Church constructed in late 1800's. Site to be preserved for the use and enjoyment of the citizens of Scugog.
Landfall Farm	By-Law 59-92 November 23, 1992	3120 Highway 7A Blackstock	Designated to recognize the 125 <sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the farm for historical purposes.
Palmer Homestead	By-Law 95-05 September 27, 2005	15238 Old Simcoe Rd. Port Perry	One of Port Perry's oldest homes dated from 1851, "salt box" architecture.

<b>Name/Historical Reference</b>	<b>Location</b>	<b>Heritage Value</b>
<p>Greenbank Centennial Hall</p> <p>St. Agnes Church</p>	<p>19965 Highway 12, Greenbank</p>	<p>Constructed in 1868, this board and batten building is an excellent example of carpenter gothic architecture. Key exterior attributes are pressed tin roof panels to look like shingles; unusual pointed gothic arch stain-glass windows; unusual rose window featuring a stain-glass Star of David.</p>
<p>Scugog Island Hall</p>	<p>2710 Demara Rd.</p>	<p>Built in 1884 and the first official meeting held there was on December 13, 1884 for the original Township of Scugog. Key exterior attributes are red brick construction, granite rubble stone foundation, two over two segmental windows with ornate brick construction, gable roof, pressed metal roof tiles, and marble date stone – 1884 AD – over front entrance.</p>
<p>Prince Albert Community Hall</p>	<p>19 Jeffery St. Prince Albert</p>	<p>The Prince Albert Community Hall is a one storey Classic Revival built in the 1860's as a social heart of the community. Key exterior attributes are: rectangular plan, moderately pitched gable roof with classical eave returns, historic wooden windows symmetrically arranged on the side walls.</p>

Cartwright Township Hall	13940 Old Scugog Rd., Blackstock	Built in 1850 and moved to its current site in 1866. Key exterior attributes are: gable roof, white clapboard siding, two over two windows, interior tin roof and walls, double doors, and original bulls eye window over front door.
Junior Fair Building Port Perry Mechanics Institute	Port Perry Fairgrounds, 15865 Old Simcoe Rd., Port Perry	Originally constructed in 1856, the Port Perry Mechanics Institute is a one storey classic revival and one of the earliest public buildings in Scugog. Key exterior attributes are: rectangular plan with tower vestibule and rear wooden tail, moderately pitched pent gabled roof with paired wooden eave brackets, wooden semi-circular sunburst decoration over the front entrance, tall slender semi-circular windows with ornamental wooden arches with false key stones.
Childhood home of Dr. Daniel David Palmer	214 Mary St., Port Perry	This property was built c. 1870 and was childhood home of Dr. Daniel David Palmer, founder of modern chiropractic.
	240 Mary St., Port Perry	This property was built c. 1870 and has heritage value for its 2 storey frame Georgian tradition architecture.
	16007 Simcoe St., Port Perry	This 2 storey brick home was built c. 1925.
